Merritt Engineering Consultants to complete parking garage restoration

Upon completion of the structural repairs, all parking spaces will be stripped to provide full functionality and a complete aesthetic look for the garage.

Previously, Merritt completed the replacement of the displaced and cracked sidewalk flags and curbs as well as a full restoration of the masonry/concrete facades at the property, including partial concrete balcony repairs.

A Kemper liquid membrane was successfully used to waterproof exposed concrete spandrels at all floor levels where years of moisture infiltration deteriorated the concrete and underlying reinforcement. Investigation and design services were also provided for the waterproofing of foundation walls at 18 townhouses and for the restoration of paved walkways
